

GOOD SCORES AT GUN TOURNEY.

Heer Leads the Shooters on Analostan Club Rifle Range.

The sixth annual tournament of the Analostan Gun Club began yesterday morning at the rifle range of the club, on the Tennallytown road, and will continue to-day.

Several famous rifle shots are entered in the lists of those shooting at the range. Some of these are Luther J. Squier, Wilmington, Del.; George Lyons, North Carolina; Thomas F. Stearns, P. A. Agelasto, B. B. Semmes, of Newport News; Robert Lowry and J. A. Anderson, of Richmond, Va.; Jack Avery, A. M. McCormick, of Washington; Frank E. Butler, W. H. Heer, J. A. R. Elliott, E. E. Lee, T. H. Elliott, E. H. Storr, William Baskerville, and R. W. Sampson.

The highest score of any so far completed is that of W. H. Heer, who has 195 out of a possible 200 points. This gives Mr. Heer a percentage of 97.5, which is a very high score for even an expert to make. Wagner, who is a Washingtonian, is in fourth place with 178. Considering his age—he is called affectionately by the shooters "Pop" Wagner—it is a very high score. Storr was expected to make a higher score. At 120 he had only lost 7, but his high shooting was not kept up, and he went down to sixth place.

The management of the tournament has been materially aided in getting the shooters around by J. A. Anderson, of Richmond, and Luther J. Squier, of Wilmington.

A large number of spectators saw the shooting from two tents which had been put up directly in the rear of the traps. There were in use yesterday two Cleggett traps, from which, in each event, were flung twenty clay targets for each shooter. There were ten events shot at the two traps.

The officers of the club in charge of the tournament are: Burrige Wilson, president; Charles S. Wilson, vice president; Miles Taylor, secretary; John Coleman, treasurer, and C. O. Wilheit, captain of the range.
